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

Artist Biographies



Gary Houston (Watson) last appeared for The Shakespeare Project as John Adams in Howard Ginsberg's *Jefferson & Adams*. His past TSP participations include *Shakeshafte*, John Kishline's *Dream Upon Avon*, *King John*, *Titus Andronicus*, *Othello*, *Much Ado About Nothing*, *Taming of the Shrew*, *The Parvenu*, *King Lear*, *Love's Labour's Lost*, *Troilus and Cressida*, *Cymbeline*, *Richard II*, *Henry VI*, *Edward III*, *Macbeth* and a full production of *Hamlet* as Claudius. Elsewhere he was Captain Falcon in *Rutherford's Travels* (Pegasus), Gulliver in *Gulliver's Last Travels*, Zig in *Bleacher Bums* and George M. Pullman in *American Enterprise* with Peter Garino (Organic), Buckingham in *Richard III* (Oak Park Festival), Prospero in *The Tempest* (European Repertory), Serebryakov in *Uncle*

Vanya (TUTA), William Blake in *Blake* and Ring Lardner in *Damon, Ring and F. Scott* (Writers' Theatre), Crofts in *Mrs. Warren's Profession* (BoarsHead), *Emma's Child*, *Berlin '45* and *Free Man of Color* (Victory Gardens), McCue in *The Front Page* and Lindner in *A Raisin in the Sun* (Goodman), Nelson Algren in *Nelson & Simone* (Live Bait), Saul Alinsky in *The Love Song of Saul Alinsky* (Terrapin), George in *Dealing*, Philip in *Mauritius* and the Brewmaster in *Free Advice from Prague* (Northlight) and the first-ever Roger aka Rump in the world premiere of *Grease* (Kingston Mines Theatre Co.). On film he appears in *Fargo*, *Hoffa*, *Proof*, *Watchmen*, *The Blues Brothers*, *Major League*, *Uncle John*, *Princess Cyd*, *Slice*, *Working Man* and many others. In print he is managing editor of *Chicago Quarterly Review*, now nearing its 25th year.



John Kishline (Henry Baker) has been an actor, director, playwright and designer in professional theatre for 45 years. He served one or more of the above functions in 200+ professional productions performed in 28 of the United States and also in Holland, England, Wales, Ireland, Sweden, Germany, India and Japan. He has written 13 produced plays and helped create at least 50 more from scratch. He was a founding member of Milwaukee's Theatre X and has performed at Next Act Theatre and with most of the other professional theatres in Milwaukee. Other work includes the Madison Repertory Theatre, and in Chicago at the Goodman Theatre, Northlight, Seanachai Theatre and many plays for The Shakespeare Project.

John is the author of last year's holiday show for The Shakespeare Project, *Dream Upon Avon*. Some of his plays have been nominated for national and regional awards and his design work won an OBIE Award from the Village Voice in New York in 1978. He is married to Deborah Clifton and lives in Whitefish Bay in Wisconsin.



Daniel Millhouse (Ryder) is thrilled to be back with The Shakespeare Project of Chicago for his second season. Daniel received his MFA from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Apart from his stage work, Daniel also does motion capture for the *Call of Duty* video game franchise with Raven Software and is an Acting Adjunct Professor at the College of DuPage. Daniel is a proud member of AEA and is represented by Gill Talent.



Henry Michael Odum (Salesman) is delighted to celebrate the season in the environs of 221b Baker Street. He has appeared with The Shakespeare Project as Pistol in *Henry the Fifth*, Dogberry in *Much Ado about Nothing*, and Adam/Corin in *As You Like It*. Favorite roles in the Chicago area include Charlie in *Stones in His Pocket* (Buffalo Ensemble), Fagin in *Oliver!* (Citadel), Tateh in *Ragtime* (Porchlight), Jack Point in *The Yeomen of the Guard* (Light Opera Works), Sir Thomas More in *A Man for All Seasons* (Bowen Park), and an assortment of curmudgeonly uncles and prospective fathers-in-law for City Lit's *Jeeves and Wooster* series. For The Project, he has been seen in *Shakeshafte* (Hastings/Campion), *My Name Is Will*, *As You Like It* (Touchstone), *Love's Labour's Lost* (Berowne), *The Changeling* (Alsemero), *King John* (the Bastard), *50-Minute Hamlet* (Guy [Hamlet]), *The Winter's Tale* (Leontes), *Julius Caesar* (Antony), and *The Revenger's Tragedy* (Vindici, the revenger). He recently understudied (and performed) *Macbeth* at Chicago Shakespeare. He was a co-founder of Chicago's Signal Ensemble Theatre, where he appeared in *Hamlet*, *The Zoo Story*, *She Stoops to Conquer*, *Waiting for Godot*, and the premiere of *Landslide*, among others. He's also appeared with Oak Park Festival (title role, *Robin Hood*), First Folio, Northlight, Next, Boxer Rebellion, New Leaf, and Sansculottes. For five years, he was a member of the acting company at Canada's Stratford Festival. Regional credits also include work with Illinois Shakespeare Festival (including Beatrice, *Much Ado...*; Ned, *Elizabeth Rex*), Montana Shakespeare in the Parks (title role, *Macbeth*), American Players Theatre, Milwaukee Rep, and Dallas Theater Center. On film, he recently completed work as Jacques Marquette in *Seau de Sang* (Bucket of Blood). He played the title role in *Richard II* and previously appeared as Doctor Caius and Bardolph in *The Merry Wives of Windsor* and Lucio in *Measure for Measure* and Faulkland in *The Rivals*. David is currently Board President and is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project, and has been involved in many Project productions over the years, performing such roles as Lear's Fool, Puck, Iago, Cassio, Petruchio, Troilus, Dogberry, Hotspur, Henry VI, Romeo and Hamlet (in The Project's full theatrical production in 1999), and directing *Richard III* and a previous edition of *Macbeth*. David originated the role of Hamlet in The Project's *50-Minute Hamlet*, frequently performed in Chicago and area schools. David received his BA from Brandeis University and MFA in Acting from Temple University, and studied acting and improvisation at the Piven Theatre Workshop.
