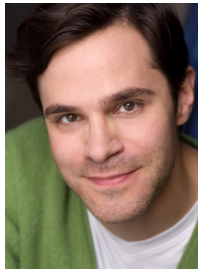

He has appeared with The Project as an actor (*Coriolanus*, *The Changeling*, *Winter's Tale*, *King Lear*, Heywood's *Fair Maid of the West*, and *Merchant of Venice*), as assistant director (*50-Minute Romeo and Juliet*), and as a music consultant (*Cardenio*). In Fall of 2015, Gary created and directed *Spooky Shakes*, an original adaptation, which was The Project's contribution to the Chicago Cultural Mile Association's inaugural event in Millennium Park. This past season, Gary also directed ShawChicago's production of *The Doctor's Dilemma*. Other recent acting credits include: Voltaire/Pangloss in Music Theater Works' *Candide*, *The Book Club Play*, at the 16th Street Theater and Drury Lane's *A Christmas Carol*. He has appeared in 19 productions for ShawChicago and with the Goodman Theatre, the Ravinia Festival, Light Opera Works, Rising Moon, Noble Fool, and Stage Left. Judy is an Artistic Associate of Chicago Dramatists, and Syzygy Theatre, and coaches lawyers in communication skills through Chicago Litigation Consultants. Currently, Sarafina is part of the faculty at Acting Studio Chicago, and works as a private audition coach and freelance director.

George Zahora (Sound Engineer) has done sound design, in various professional and non-professional capacities, for more than 25 years, and has been composing original music since 2012. You've heard his work in dozens of Project readings over the last eight years. Additional recent work includes shows at Oak Park Festival Theatre (*Macbeth*, *You Can't Take It With You*, *The African Company Presents Richard III*, *I and You*), where he's also an artistic associate, and many productions at the already-much-missed ShawChicago. Upcoming projects: *Elizabeth Rex* and *Much Ado About Nothing* for OPFT's summer season. George is also a playwright, and is currently putting the finishing touches on *Christmas Comes But Once A Year*, The Shakespeare Project's holiday offering for 2019. Peter Garino (Artistic Director) is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago and has served as Artistic Director since June 2010. He will direct *Richard III* in The Project's 2019-2020 season. This past season, he appeared as Marcus Andronicus in *Titus Andronicus* and as Helicanus in *Pericles*, *Prince of Tyre*. He also directed *The Roaring Girl* in May 2019. He adapted and directed The Project's holiday show this past season, *A Selection of English Christmas Carols/A Baker Street Christmas Caper*. Last season, he directed *Much Ado About Nothing* and played the Duke of Florence in *Women Beware Women* and Duke Senior and Duke Frederick in *As You Like It*. He also directed John Kishline's *Dream Upon Avon* and Rowan Williams' *Shakeshafte* for The Shakespeare Project. Previous appearances with The Project include Boyet/Anthony Dull in *Love's Labour's Lost*, Sir Thomas Erpingham and the Duke of Burgundy in *Henry V* and Tackleton in Charles Dickens' *The Cricket on the Hearth*. Peter directed the Chicago premier of Tom Stoppard's *Darkside* (Incorporating The Dark Side of the Moon by Pink Floyd). Other appearances for The Project include the Bard in *Cymbeline*, Camillo in *The Winter's Tale*, the title role in *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar*. Lord LaFew in *All's Well That Ends Well* and Antonio in *The Merchant of Venice*. Other directing credits for The Shakespeare Project include: *King John*, *Cardenio*, *The Revenger's Tragedy*, *King Lear*, *The Fair Maid of the West*, *The Reign of King Edward III*, *A Woman Killed*

With Kindness, Othello, The Tempest, Richard II, Measure For Measure, Antony and Cleopatra, The Importance of Being Earnest, A Woman of No Importance, Pericles (1996 and 2008), The Taming of the Shrew, 2 Henry IV, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and his own adaptations of Shakespeare's sonnets and songs, *My Name Is Will*, and *The Rape of Lucrece*. Other appearances with The Project include Friar Laurence/Lord Capulet in *50-Minute Romeo and Juliet*, Agamemnon in *Troilus & Cressida*, George Page in *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, Cardinal Wolsey in *Henry VIII*, Lord Stanley in *Richard III* and many others. Peter has worked with the Steppenwolf and Organic Theatre companies, the Body Politic, Pegasus Players and with the Oak Park Festival Theatre and Illinois Shakespeare Festival (three seasons). Peter attended the National Shakespeare Conservatory and holds a Master of Fine Arts degree in Acting from Illinois State University and a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre Arts from Hofstra University, New York. He is a proud member of Actors' Equity Association, and SAG/AFTRA.

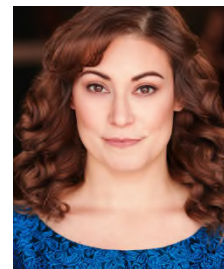

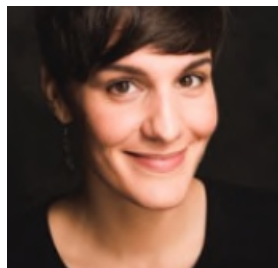
